



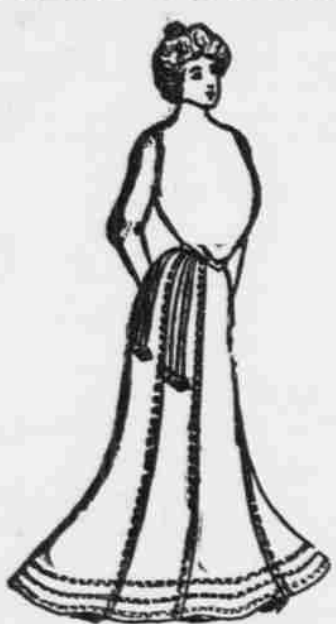

Funeral of W. C. Hildebrand

The body of the late W. C. Hildebrand arrived here from Reno, Nev., Friday night, the fraternal order of which he was a member taking charge of the body and removed the remains to his former home.

The funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at the Baptist church, Rev. S. A. Douglas conducting the services.

The K. P.'s, B. P. O. E.'s, W. O. W.'s, the United Artisans and the city council each attended the funeral services in a body. Many of the business places of the city were closed to business, as the procession passed, and a large crowd followed, showing the high esteem in which the deceased was held by his fellow citizens.

Further particulars show that he committed suicide by shooting himself in the temple, his body not being found until the next morning, when members of the household went to call him for breakfast. The real cause of his deed is not known.
