Oregon Women Honored.

Mrs. J. R. Phelps-Montgomery of Portland, Oregon, a member of the board of lady managers of the World's Fair, is the latest possibility for the position of president of the board, Mrs. Montgomery is now in the city, having arrived Sunday, says the St. Louis Globe Democrat.

She is one of the earliest appointees to the board and since its organization has been one of the most prominent figures in its councils. She is a native Missourian of very distinguished stock, being a daughter of former Gov. Phelps. While Mrs. Montgomery is not making any canvass for the presidency, it is thought that she would accept the honor if proffered. She was a visitor at the Administration building yesterday, but would not discuss her proposed candidacy. The next meeting of the board of lady managers is set for December 15.

Portland on Celilo Railroad.

Whether to repeal the portage railway law or allow it to remain on the statute books of the state, is receiving more consideration by members of the legislature and business men than is being given to the tax law. It is practically settled that the latter will be repealed or amended at the extra session, but the former proposition is still in doubt.

Former enthusiasts for the passage of the law are willing to permit a repeal if it can be shown that the National Government is really in earnest about the construction of the canal. In this connection the opinion of F. E. Beach, president of the Board of Trade, covers the subject. He says:

"I see no reason why the law should not be repealed if the stories about the Federal Government going ahead at once with the canal are true. I have talked to many regarding that, but opinion appears to be divided. Some claim that it is simply railroad talk, to work up sentiment favorable to the repeal of the law, while others contend that the Government is going ahead with the work.

"The Board of Trade is anxious to see the river opened no matter how it is done, but I do not think it will be necessary for the state to go on with the portage road if the Federal government takes hold. Our committee has decided to take no steps until about the time the legislature convenes, and by that time we will be better informed. Should it be shown that all of the talk emanates from the railroad, I am sure the Board of Trade will fight any attempt to repeal the law."

The Chamber of Commerce committee was very active in its efforts to have the law passed, and there is little likelihood of the members receding from their former opinion regarding the state constructing the road.—Telegram.

Abrogates the Moro Treaty.

MANILA, Nov. 21.—General Wood captured the Moro position in the hills of Jolo, north of Taglib, on the 20th inst., and destroyed the earthworks they had thrown up there. Private Martin Brennan, of the Fourteenth Cavalry, was killed during the engagement, and two privates were wounded, one seriously. The loss on the Moro side is known to have been 75, probably more, as the ground is covered with brush, and bodies are hard to find.

The expedition returned to Jolo, and pending an investigation, General Wood says that so far as he can see there will be no more opposition on the part of the Sultan's men, who led the fighting.

According to his understanding, this action on the part of the Moros abrogates the Bates treaty.
