### GAME LAWS OF OREGON.

At this season of the year there are beginning to come in inquiries as to the open and closed season PLAINDEALER prints the following brief synopsis furnishing the information:

Male deer, antelope and moun tain sheep, open season July 15 to November 1. Female deer, August 15 to November 1. Killing of spotted fawns, elk or beaver prohibited at all times of vear. No one is allowed to take more than five deer in a season. Night hunting or with dogs, the purchase or sale of hides without tags, or of venison, prohibited.

Open season for silver grey squirrel, October 1 to January 1. Quail, grouse, native pheasants, prairie chickens, open season October 1 to December 1; limit, 10 birds per day. Douglas county, Sept. 1 to Dec. 1.

Ducks, geese, swan, open season from September 15 to January 1: limit of ducks, 100 per week or 50 in one day.

Eggs of game and song birds protected the year around.

Trout, open season April 1 to November 1. To be taken with hook and line only. Sale prohibited at all times. The laws of the State require
