OUR PRUNE PRODUCT

This State Leads the World in the Prune Industry—Benton has Largest Dryer

Oregon leads the world today in the cultivation of the Italian or Oregon prune as it is now known in the market, its European identity being lost in the superiority of the new world product, says Alma A. Rogers in Sunset Magazine. No where else is this fruit grown to such perfection as in the mild, moist climate of the Willamette, Umpqua and Rogue river valleys. It will not endure the heats of lower latitudes, and in the east its culture is prevented by an insect pest.

The Oregon prune is a distinct and peculiar variety, differing decidedly from any other member of the plum family. Its distinguishing characteristics is a subacid which gives it a tart flavor very agreeable to the palate and of high medicinal virtue. There is no more wholesome article of diet. Chemists find in its sedative properties, in the classification of food elements the large proportion of phosphorus indicates its value as a brain food.

In favor of the Oregon prune is a dark violet blue with a light blue bloom. It is a free-stone with the skin clear yellow. After drying the outside becomes a glossy black and the inside a deep amber. The large varieties make a delicious crockery. The exceptional quality of the fruit are due, in large measure to the process of an air, which is accomplished by the most improved method of evaporation, requiring a special treatment differing in that of cut fruits.

The prunes begin to ripen the latter part of September, the harvest continuing through October. They are allowed to remain on the trees until fully matured, when they drop to the ground. At careful gathering, assisted by gentle shaking of the boughs, they are put through a modern grading machine which separates them into uniform sizes, thereby hastening the drying, and also freeing them from twigs and leaves. Next they are dipped into a hot water bath to cleanse and soften the skin, then spread upon trays and placed in ovens where by means of steam pipes currents of hot air in rapid circulation are driven through the fruit. The fruit emerges from the process soft and pliable, yet with sufficient moisture removed to insure its keeping qualities.

The largest prune orchard in Oregon, and the largest prune evaporator in the world is located in Benton county, about five miles from Corvallis. The average daily output of this dryer, when running at capacity is about 2300 pounds.
