W. C. T. U. Proposes to Have Its Provisions Entered.

PORTLAND, Dec. 7 .- (To the Editor)-Will you please publish the following tobacco law of the state of Oregon, which was enacted by the request of the W. C. Assistant Recording Secretary.

The law follows: An act to prohibit the sale of tobacco, igars, or eigarettes to minors under the age of 18 years, and the use of tobacco, igars and cigarettes by such minors in any public place, and to repeal the act enticled, An act to prohibit the sale of tobacco, cigars or cigarettes to minors under the age of 18 years, approved February 18, 1880. Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to sell, barter, trade, give or in any manner furnish to any minor under the age of 18 years any tobacco, cigar, or cigarette in any form, or any compound in which tobacco forms a component part, without the written consent or order of such minor's parent or guardian, then in that case consent may be given by the Coun ty Court, sitting for the transaction of county business, upon the proper application in the county in which said ninor may have his residence.

Sec. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction. be fined in any sum not less than two

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 years to smoke, or in any way use any cigar, place, square, or resort.


