

# UNCEASING HAUNT WORSE THAN DEATH

Eugene, March 14.—When Claude Branton was hanged for the murder of John A. Lind a few years ago at Eugene he made a confession on the scaffold of which the following is an extract:

"There are no successful criminals. They may live and escape death at the hands of the law, but there is an inflexible, unceasing haunt, worse than death. I will swing out into eternity, there to meet my benefactor and kneel to beg for forgiveness. I haven't much to say. I pray God that no man will run my folks down on account of this. They are innocent."

And now John Branton, brother of Claude, languishes in the jail here, charged with having attempted the murder of his benefactor and friend, John Fletcher, in a cold blooded and heartless fashion at Cottage Grove.

Claude Branton's murder of Lind was peculiarly revolting. Lind was supposed to have money on his person. As he was asleep a pistol was placed in his hand and his brains blown out. The body was thrown into a large fire in an attempt to burn it. Finding this too slow, the body was chopped to pieces with an ax and fed to the fire in sections. The scene of this revolting murder was high up on the summit of the Cascade mountains along the roadway from Eugene to Eastern Oregon.
