### EUGENE LOSES ITS WOOLEN MILLS

The Eugene woolen mill, which was recently purchased by Will Wright and J. P. Wilbur, of Union, will be removed to Hood River, the citizens of that place having taken \$20,000 worth of stock in the concern. It is not learned when the plant will be done so, but it is presumed that it will be done soon.

Strenuous efforts were made by Mr. Friendly and other prominent Eugene citizens to keep the mill there, but to no avail. Hood River, being closer to the wool growing belt, was thought by the new owners to be a better location, besides the monetary inducement offered by the people of that enterprising place were tempting.
