## FIRE ARMS OF ALL THE WORLD

Collection of Lee S. Wright of Portland, A Former Roseburg Boy.

Sunday June 18th, the Portland Journal devoted nearly a full page to pictures and a descriptive article of Lee S. Wright, and his collection of rare fire arms. Mr. Wright is a brother of W. T. Wright and Mrs. D. S. West of Roseburg and is well and favorably known here. The Journal said:

From the old corners of the globe during the last 15 years a Portland letter-carrier has gathered a collection of small arms and other weapons which is undoubtedly one of the most remarkable of its kind in existence. The collector is Lee S. Wright, carrier No. 3, in the local postoffice, and the collection, of which he is justly proud, occupies numerous walls and shelves at his home in this city.

Mr. Wright began his collection in 1890, and since then, with the aid of rare good luck and of friends who have made frequent trips abroad, he has pushed the search that has been so well rewarded. There is hardly a country, people or age but has contributed to the fulfillment of his desires, and a visit to his home, where his treasures are displayed, is like a journey from the present through the historic past to the time of primal man.

In prosecuting his search for ancient and peculiar weapons, Mr. Wright has forsaken the paths of conventional relic-seekers and sought out a way of his own. The result is that many rare specimens have been brought to light which otherwise not have been obtained. His extensive acquaintance as a letter-carrier has done no little toward assisting him in his work.

"Pistol collecting is worse than coin or stamp collecting," he said. "For when once you begin collecting a coin or stamp, there is no hope of a cure. Occasionally a stamp or coin find 'gets wire' to himself and finds his work too laborious or having too little recompense, but with an arm collector it is never the case. I have never known one to quit after beginning—he goes on forever, looking for strange, peculiar weapons." In the way of blades, Mr. Wright's collection presents even as great a variety as in the way of weapons. Unlike the firearms, there is no distinct dividing line by which to measure the progress in their manufacture. Gold, silver, precious stones and rare woods have been used in various ways, while there is also great ingenuity in devising strange and complex mechanisms.

In Mr. Wright's collection there are almost every kind of dagger, dirk and knife, from the delicate Italian Poard to the bolo of the Philippine. He has swords that did gallant service in the Mexican and civil wars, and another feature of the collection, of which by the way, he is extremely proud, is a fine Revolutionary sword that was used in the days of '76.

Side by side in the collection, with histories as varied as they possibly could be, are a Korean bow and arrows, used in the last Korean war, and an old Hudson's bay tomahawk pipe. There is a Cuban machete that was picked up at San Juan hill August 15, 1898, by an American volunteer. There is a head hunter's axe from the Philippine islands, and the famous way blade poison knife. The collection includes an Italian Maifa knife, double-edged, that was made to be held in the hand like a cork-screw. In the collection are weapons of every conceivable shape and make. There is a pair of tiny revolvers less than two inches in length and a quarter of an ounce in weight, while there are also huge ancient weapons that in size of projectiles exceed many modern cannons.

A detailed account of each of the 165 peculiar weapons forming the collection would be impossible. One of the queerest, and from the standpoint of historical interest, one of the most valuable is an Arabian blunderbuss, with a flint lock and very old. It is still in fine condition and has a barrel well suited for shooting rocks as well as bullets. In deed almost any projectile could easily be put in the barrel.

Another blunderbuss in the collection is an English brass-barrel pistol. There is a bayonet attached which folds under the barrel and when released by pulling the trigger-guard is thrown into position by a spring. As nearly as can be ascertained this pistol is over 160 years old.

There is another Arabian weapon in the collection that undoubtedly has an interesting history. It is of the pattern shown in the famous paintings of the "Slave Market." The handle is of inlaid silver which at one time was covered with valuable jewels.

There is also an English oval, or bell-muzzle, pistol of the blunderbuss variety. It also has a bayonet folding under the barrel. Belgium is represented in the collection by a pocket-knife cap-and-ball pistol. It is a freak in any collection and likely has few duplicates in the world. The barrel is on the back of the knife, while there is a cork screw for a trigger. The knife blade attached is over four inches in length.

There is an English flint-lock pistol that was brought from Scotland and presented to Mr. Wright for his collection by Mr. Robert Livingston. The pistol is very old. It is double-barreled and one hammer fires both barrels either together or separately, as desired.

What is known as the "understriker" is a novelty in pistols. It has a hammer underneath the barrel, arranged so that there will be no obstruction to the view in sighting along the barrel. Another novelty is an old English revolver that has a hole in the hammer through which to sight. It is finely engraved, and in its day must have been an expensive weapon.

A pair of dueling pistols in the collection was made in Tyrol Switzerland. A double-barrel dagger pistol is said to have been the means by which a man was killed, for which the murderer was hanged. A peculiar specimen is what is called the "knuckle pistol." It is a 22-caliber and holds six cartridges in its chamber. Besides its use as a revolver it can also be used as brass knucks.

Three hundred years is the estimated age of a Korean pistol in the collection. It is 20 inches in length and was fired by a slow-burning fuse with a match lock. The name of the original owner is inscribed in silver on top of the barrel. The collection has a Flobert pistol brought from Manila and presented by Dr. Sanford Whiting.

A pair of curious Japanese pistols always attract the attention of persons examining the collection. They were secured by Dr. J. Hunter Wells while touring Japan. One is an engraved cap-and-ball pistol while the other is brass, using blank primed shells, central fire, and is loaded by hand as a muzzle-loading gun. Both have attachments with which they may be carried on the person without the use of a holster.
