VERDICT AGAINST SENATOR MITCHELL

est of each of the parties to this agreement, as to all services rendered, all moneys received and all business done by the firm shall be the equal one half thereof, except that for any services which may be rendered by said John H. Mitchell, in the City of Washington, D. C., either in the Supreme Court of the United States, the Court of Claims or before Congress, or any of the departments, shall be the individual matter, and claim of said John H. Mitchell, and all fees so earned by him in either of said courts, or before Congress, or any of said departments, and his salary as Senator, shall be the individual property of said John H. Mitchell, and the firm shall have no interest therein. But for all services rendered by the firm or either member of it in any other place save and except as above shall be considered firm business and the parties equally interested therein—was such an agreement as the parties had a right to enter into, notwithstanding his office as Senator of the United States. It was his right to act as an attorney in the Supreme Court of the United States and Court of Claims, or before Congress, or before any of the departments, in all matters in which the United States was not directly or indirectly interested, and unless it is proved that such provision in the partnership agreement was intended to cover services before said courts or in Congress or in some department of the Government with respect to matters in which the United States was directly or indirectly interested, the said provision in the agreement was legal and you must find that the defendant had no unlawful or illegal purpose in embodying such a provision in the said agreement.

The defendant cannot be held criminally liable for any agreement entered into by his partner, A. H. Tanner, in the firm name or for any acts, professional or otherwise, in connection with the matters referred to in the indictment, unless it is proven beyond a reasonable doubt that it was understood between the defendant and Tanner that Tanner should agree or act, or that the defendant at the time such agreements were entered into by his partner in the firm name, or such professional, or other acts were done by said Tanner in the firm name knew and consented to the making of such agreements by the said Tanner, and whether there was such knowledge or consent upon the part of defendant may be proven by circumstantial evidence.

Defendant's Intent or Knowledge

So also the question of the defendant's intent or knowledge, if you find that he received any part of the check given by Kribbs, is to be determined by you from all the facts and circumstances surrounding the transaction, which you may deem established by the evidence. You will consider not only the facts and circumstances relied upon by the Government to show this knowledge, but also any other fact or circumstance which, in your judgment, may tend to show that the defendant was without knowledge in relation to such matters. The government is not required to furnish direct evidence of the defendant's knowledge or intent, but such knowledge or intent may be established by circumstantial evidence, if sufficient for that purpose. The rule in relation to circumstantial evidence, as applied in the trial of a defendant charged with crime is this: In order to justify a jury in finding a verdict of guilty, based entirely on circumstantial evidence, the circumstances must not only be consistent with the guilt of the defendant, but they must be inconsistent with any other reasonable hypothesis that can be predicated on the evidence; or, stated in another form, it is not sufficient that the circumstances prove, coincide with, account for, and therefore render probable the hypothesis of guilt, as asserted by the prosecution, but they must exclude to a moral certainty and beyond a reasonable doubt, every other hypothesis but the single one of guilt, or the jury must find the defendant not guilty.

This rule, in relation to circumstantial evidence is not difficult to understand or apply. The jury in the first place must determine from the testimony of witnesses what are the facts and circumstances in the case; the facts and circumstances which you believe have been established by the testimony, and then you simply apply your common sense and judgment to a consideration of what deductions or inferences, or conclusions ought to be drawn from these facts, and if, when the evidence is thus considered, you are satisfied in your own minds, beyond all reasonable doubt, that the defendant is guilty, then it is your duty to so declare, and if you are not so satisfied, it will be your duty to render a verdict of not guilty.

There has been evidence offered tending to show that fees have been wrongfully taken by the firm of Mitchell & Tanner in the Benson matter, the Burke matter and a number of other transactions not included in the indictment. This evidence you will lay aside, until you have first determined from all the other evidence in the case that the defendant rendered to Kribbs the services charged in the indictment, and actually received a portion of the fee paid by Kribbs to Mitchell & Tanner, or to Tanner, for such services, and then, if you find such to be the facts, you may consider the Benson, Burke and other transactions in considering the question whether the defendant knowingly received compensation from Kribbs for the services charged in the indictment, and in considering that question, you will give to this evidence such weight as you think it is entitled to. And what I have just said in relation to the Benson, Burke and other transactions not charged in the indictment will also apply to the evidence offered by the Government in relation to the payment made by Kribbs on or about December 3, 1903 (Gentlemen, I may be mistaken about this date, but if I am you will have to correct me in that matter), concerning certain lieu selections, because this transaction, whatever it may have been, is not charged in the indictment.
