Mr. Ryan is a man of deeds rather than words, and it is his policy as well as his nature to avoid publicity. His career is a typical one. He is descended from Scotch-Irish ancestors who came to this country before the Revolution. Mr. Ryan was born fifty-three years ago on a farm in Virginia. His mother died when he was five, and he went to live with his grandmother at the old homestead. The family had been impoverished by the civil war, and young Ryan as a boy of fifteen sought to straighten out the entanglements of the estate, but the task was too much for the future vizard of finance. He got his first ousiness training as a clerk in a Balimore dry goods house. Two years after entering its employ the proprictor decided to establish a bank in New York and thought so well of Ryan vetted for gallantry and received the "Smilee's w from Boseburg via Myrtle Form that he gave him a position in it. This was a fortunate move, for it put him in touch with the great financial interests of the country and awakened his ambition to attain power in Wall street affairs. Two years later he became






