Glendale Reporter Again Heard From

On the walls of the Old Fort, a whisper seemed to say, they are gone. In early childhood we had heard the story of that remarkable journey, and all along the line of life we heard it over again. And finally when the beloved father was passing his last days at our home in Glendale he repeated the old story, as the aged invariably refer to the incidents of their earlier life, when they are nearing the border line. Oh, how the old times came over me as I stood beneath the portals of the Old Fort. It was indeed a haven of rest to those grand pioneers. My father spent three weeks as the guest of Gen. Sutter before he started east. And again upon his return in 1846 he stayed several months at Sutter Fort. And the friendship between my father and Gen. Sutter was a lifelong friendship. The California people who were with me very kindly said to me, "you have a right to rejoice with us for your father was a California pioneer." I rejoiced at the privilege, for who can properly conceive, or much less describe the restless energy of those pioneer men or the heroic devotion of their pioneer women, who have by their boundless enterprise wrested this fair land from a wilderness and reclaimed useless canyons and swamps, the former yielding its millions in yellow gold and the latter made more fertile than the valleys of the Nile, and making of this fair state a land of flowers and sunshine. Yet we turn from all its beauty to our own beloved Oregon. The land of song and story. The one place in all the world to us, most dear. The place of sepulture of our honored parents and grandparents. Oh, Oregon, forever dear, to you belongs the first place in our heart, fair sisterhood of states. We love you only to adore the other.

After a brief visit in Sparks, Nevada, and Santa Rosa, Cal., we will return home to Glendale.
