WHAT IS GOING ON AT THE COURTHOUSE

Items Which Will be of Interest to the Taxpayers

A marriage license has been issued to Moore Plomondon and Mattie V. Garrison, both of Scottsburg.

A suit of foreclosure of mortgage and to recover money has been filed by the First National Bank against Victor Phelps, Robert Phelps and Mary E. Phelps.

A writ of review was filed in which A. J. Bellows et al. 46 other petitioners are named as defendants and the City of Roseburg plaintiff in the case of the incorporation of the city of West Roseburg. C. S. Jackson appears as attorney for the city.

A case has been filed in the circuit court by Attorney Louis Barzee wherein Wm. Schmidt, of San Francisco, secretary of the Schmidt Hotel and Investment Co., formerly proprietors of the Hotel McCallen, is plaintiff and Fred Gettins is defendant. In the complaint it is alleged that Mr. Gettins owed the Schmidt Hotel and Investment Co. \$298.76 for board and room of which amount the defendant paid \$43.75 and refused to pay the balance of \$255. The plaintiff asks for judgment in the sum of \$55 with 6 per cent interest from Nov. 12, 1903 and costs and disbursements of the case.

Louis Case who was arrested Monday morning by Deputy Sheriff Boyd on a charge of assault with a dangerous weapon, and who waived examination and gave \$500 bonds for appearance at next term of Circuit Court, was again placed under arrest on an information filed by District Attorney Brown charging Case with assault with intent to kill. Deputy Sheriff Boyd again placed Case under arrest and at a late hour Tuesday night he was admitted to bail upon a bond of \$1000 signed by W. C. McWilliams and J. B. Waite. The trouble which caused the arrest of Case, occurred last Sunday evening when the defendant fired several shots at E. H. Mahn, E. B. Matthews and L. D. Carey, who were hunting in a portion of the McWilliams place which is leased by Mahn and located about 3 1/2 miles east of this city. At the invitation of Mahn, Mr. Matthews and Mr. Carey were hunting on Mahn's place when without warning, as it is stated, Case opened fire upon them with a rifle from a concealed position in a fence corner of the adjoining field where Case has a cabin. Case at the time of the shooting said that he was after that "fist faced" Mahn with whom he had had trouble before. When the officer went to arrest him he stood Sheriff Boyd off with a gun until he was convinced that he was not wanted for murder and that no one was hurt. He seemed surprised that he had not hit any of the party and said that his weapon was getting bad. On account of a light burning in Mahn's house all night he thought he was firing at him, and that they were sitting up with him. Case makes no secret of the fact that it was his intention to kill Mahn and seemed ready to suffer the penalty for it, or for what he has already done.
