JURY FINDS BARNES GUILTY AS CHARGED

The celebrated case of the State vs. John C. Barnes, the man who is charged with having killed W. H. Graham, near Glendale, last April, has been engaging the attention of the Circuit Court most of this week.

District Attorney Geo. M. Brown, was assisted in the prosecution by J. M. Williams, one of Eugene's attorneys, while the defense was made by Attorneys Cardwell & Watson, J. E. Sawyers and J. A. Buchanan. The jury was: A. L. Butler, Scottsburg; Edward Hancock, Elkton; Marian Ryan, Drain; W. A. Pearce, Millwood; Lee Love, Wilbur; W. H. Coats, Tenmile; W. H. Graham, Deer Creek; Norman Agee, Winston; C. N. Moody, Stacy; J. D. Strong and I. H. Knight, Myrtle Creek.

Monday and Tuesday were taken up by the state and thirty-six witnesses were on the stand. It was conceded that although the evidence was entirely circumstantial, yet a good strong case had been made against the accused. Some of the points proven were that defendant had in his possession, after the charged remains of the dead man, were found on a burned brush heap on the railroad track, the pistol, gold nugget, belt and hat of the deceased.

Yesterday morning the defense started in and it did not take much time to examine three witnesses whose evidence was offered. Much of the day was taken by the able arguments of the attorneys to the jury, and late last evening Judge Harris, of Eugene, who has been presiding, charged the jury.

At 8:15 last evening, the jury came into court and asked for some additional instructions, and inquired of the court as to whether a verdict in the second degree could be brought in. To this Judge Harris responded that he supposed such a verdict could be brought in, but he evidently did not expect such a return, from the tone of his voice, and in face of the fact that no evidence had been introduced to show that the dead had been committed in self defense.

Again the jury retired and at nine o'clock, with Attorney Buchanan present to represent the defendant, who was also present, the jury filed in and foreman C. N. Moody, read the verdict of "guilty in the first degree," while the court room was as still as death. Then Clerk Lenox polled the jury and as each jurymen was named his response was "aye," making it a unanimous verdict.

The penalty is hanging and Judge Harris will, in a day or so, fix the date when the penalty shall be inflicted upon Barnes.
