## CANYONVILLE FOLKS ON THE WAR PATH

Canyonville, Oct. 11, 1935.—Word was received early this morning that war had been declared between Greece and the United States and that Brigadier General Linevitch Veitallen had been ordered to the front in charge of a detail of Roseburg squad of brave soldiers, and that he was under orders to capture the entire Greek forces. Realizing that our fair, live and energetic town was in danger of invasion the Honorable Mayor was urged to call for volunteers to enter upon a campaign both offensive and defensive. While the Hon. Mayor was preparing his call, Mr. Thomas Wilson hung his large and beautiful American flag upon the side of his store, giving indisputable evidence of his loyalty to his country and flag.

Mayor, a large number of our brave, young and active citizens, assembled in the city's magnificent and highly polished city hall, when, realizing that only true young, active and brave were needed, a large company was organized, with the officers selected as follows: Wm.
