THE GRAND JURY'S FINAL REPORT

At eight o'clock, Saturday night, the members of the grand jury appeared before Judge Hamilton, of the circuit court, and made the following report, upon receipt of which the body was excused and dismissed from further duty:

"We the grand jury, at the Oct. 1, 1905, term of the circuit court of Douglas county, Oregon, in our final report, say: "That we have investigated the charges of crime coming to our knowledge and have disposed of the same, according to our best judgment.

"Our session has been prolonged on account of the riot by the Greeks at Glenbrook, entailing upon us many days of hard work, in making an investigation of the same.

"We recommend that the Sheriff be supplied with sufficient shelving for the purpose of taking proper care of the records of said office.

"We recommend that the county court cause the courthouse roof to be painted, also the electric wiring should be thoroughly examined, as it is the opinion of the grand jury, from an examination made by us, that the courthouse is in an unsafe condition on account of the electric wiring. We have also examined the county jail and find it in an unsanitary condition and recommend an overhauling of the plumbing; the window gratings and ceiling should be repaired. For the protection of the jailer, coal should be substituted for wood, as fuel. A fence should be built around the jail, of sufficient height and strength to prohibit all intruders from approaching it.

"We recommend that a window be placed in the south wall of the clerk's office, as better light is needed.

"We are under many obligations to our District Attorney, Hon. Geo. M. Brown, for the many courtesies shown us during our session.

"We desire to thank the Hon. Lawrence T. Harris for his kindness and wish to congratulate the people of the Second Judicial District upon its two excellent Circuit Judges, to-wit: Hon. Lawrence T. Harris and Hon. J. W. Hamilton. Respectively submitted: I, E. Harvey, Foreman, Wm. Buxton, M. L. Brown, Joe Turpin, Simon Caro, P. E. Swearinger and W. H. Graham.

GREEKS ARE NOW IN LAW'S TOILS

Four of the Greeks who were found guilty of inciting a riot at Glenbrook, when Mrs. Petersein was killed are now in the toils of the law. Their names are: Antone Mizes, Jas. Pianter, Tom George and Peter Demas.

A jury consisting of A. L. Black, of Millwood; W. H. Goats, Ten Mile; C. N. Moody, Stacy; G. W. Grubb, Wilbur; Grafton Worthington, Roseburg; C. Mescham and C. D. Drain, of Drain; J. L. Cole, H. F. Dardoff, A. F. Brown and E. A. Davison, of Oakland, are now passing upon the evidence against Antone Mizes. The prosecution is being conducted by District Attorney Brown, while Judge Fullerton, F. G. Macmillan and A. N. Orcutt are appearing for the defendants.

The state finished offering its testimony, Saturday evening and this morning the defense began its side of the case.

It is pretty generally understood that as this case goes, so will go the charges against the others. In other words, it Mizes it found guilty by the jury, then the others will probably plead guilty, or if he gets off, then the others are likely to go free.

Evidently the Greeks do not expect much trouble out of the matter, for last evening forty-three of them were given a car all to themselves and were sent to Portland, from whence it is understood that they will be sent out into some other community. But they are likely to forever after this keep away from Douglas county, as they do not feel as though this is a very good county for them to carry on their labors.
