### DOUGLAS COUNTY IS GROWING

County Assessor, G. W. Staley, has just compiled some statistics which indicate very plainly, that Douglas county is keeping fully abreast the times in the matter of increase in population. This report, which is just completed, makes a fine showing. By it one finds that in the past year there has been an increase of 1861 inhabitants. Every ten years the federal census is taken and then the state of Oregon takes a like enumeration of the people, also every ten years, but one comes five years after the other. In 1900 the government's count showed that Douglas county had 14,565 people, while the figures just secured by County Assessor, Staley, show that we have 16,426, or an increase of 1861.

The different precincts and their population are as follows: West Roseburg, 1,378; Umpqua, 1,203; Deer Creek, 577; Roseburg, 1,882; Pass Creek, 1,009; Yoncalla, 823; Comstock, 351; Scottsburg, 276; Bohemia, 19; Gardiner, 908; Elkton, 525; Calapooia, 504; Oakland, 3851; Kellogg, 203; Millwood, 176; Coles Valley, 302; Wilbur, 301; Looking Glass, 356; East Umpqua, 301; Mount Scott, 129; Olalla, 325; Canby Valley, 307; Civil Bend, 451; Myrtle Creek, 951; Canyon City, 479; Days Creek, 226; Perdue, 328; Cow Creek, 251; Riddle, 503; Glendale, 629.

Such statistics are decidedly encouraging and will help to convince the skeptical that this county is moving right along in all that means for its betterment.

### MYRTLE CREEK MINES TO FRONT

Rich Properties in That Section Already Attracting Deserved Attention.

While in Myrtle Creek, Friday, the editor of the Plaindealer discovered that undoubtedly a veritable boom in the mining industry of that vicinity is rapidly approaching. He could see evidence of it on all sides. Wagons were noticed, hauling ore from the mines to the railroad, for shipment to the smelter. Gangs of workmen were to be seen, headed for the rich claims, while even the atmosphere seemed pregnant with the "mining fever." But he stumbled on to abundant proof that there was more than mere gossip to substantiate the claims of the happy mine owners. For instance, Mr. John Hamilton, one of the owners of the "Little Caledonia" mine had just received very gratifying returns from a carload of ore which big corporations had shipped to the laundry smelter as a start. He was notified that it would net him all of \$100 per ton. No wonder Mr. Hamilton smiled, when he imparted the good news to the Plaindealer man. He says that work on the promising property will now be pushed with all possible haste and that as much ore as possible will be handled off before the roads become impassable.

Mr. Hamilton, in common with a host of others, hopes that they and far distant when the Southern Pacific will build a spur from this point to Rose Hill mines. This would shorten the haul by 100 miles, and the cost of shipping the ore would be cut down to a minimum. The timber and labor required for the construction of such a spur would be enormous, but the financial results would be well worth the expense. The mine owners are looking forward to the day when the mine will be in full operation, and the town will be a great center of activity.
