WANT INSPECTOR TO CONDEMN TREES

The fruit growers of Douglas county have been taking a lively interest in the well intended efforts of County Fruit Inspector Drew, to free this county from all pests whatever, and they heartily second his good work, even though in some instances it has worked a decided hardship upon some of them. However, they are philosophically inclined, and they are sensible enough to realize that if such a campaign is carried on successfully, that it means money in the pockets of the fruitgrowers, in the long run.

Yesterday, Messrs. W. C. Steele and J. T. Spangh, two of looking Glass's enterprising fruit growers were at the county seat, purchasing spraying supplies for a thorough campaign along this line. Mr. Spangh, in conversation with the Plaindealer man, took occasion to remark: "We wish the county Fruit Inspector would go right ahead and do as he is authorized by law to do, namely, condemn and destroy trees which are infected. It would encourage some of us who are striving to produce good fruit. Let him look around and he will soon discover that many growers are trying to comply with the law, while on the other hand, not a few seem to care very little about the matter. The latter persons do not make any efforts along this line and it is decidedly discouraging for the rest of us to go ahead and do anything, knowing as we do, that our trees are certain to be infected by those bad trees. Wish the Plaindealer would call Mr. Drew's attention to this matter. We believe he is in earnest, and when he knows that the average fruit grower is at his back we feel certain that he will take up the good work and push it. Let him give the owners who do not care, a short notice, time in which to demonstrate that they do not intend doing anything, then let him go ahead and have those infected trees destroyed. To my way of thinking therein lies the future salvation of the fruit growing industry of this county."
