THE LADIES WOULD LIKE TO VOTE

In Seattle, last month on the question of issuing \$500,000 worth of school bonds, only 544 men voted. There are some people who would say that it was plain that the vast majority of the men of Seattle "didn't want to vote," and that, therefore, all the men of Seattle should be denied the right to vote—that is, they would say so if they were consistent, for they deny the ballot to women, on the ground that "women do not want it," and they base their assertion that women do not want it, on the fact in those states where women have merely school suffrage, only a minority of women vote in the election of school trustees. Let them look to the states where women have equal rights with men and they will find that women vote as generally as do men. The Wyoming Secretary of State, reports that 90 per cent of the women of Wyoming vote. Former Governor Steenbergh of Idaho and Senator Patterson and Teller of Colorado, are authorities for the statement that women vote as generally as do men in Idaho and Colorado, and universal testimony from Utah, is that similar conditions obtain in that State. That women vote where they have full political rights, is the best evidence that they want to vote.

ALEXIS NICHOLAIEVITCH.

Heir to Throne of All the Russias, an Infant With Titles Galore.

If ever little Alexis Nicholaievitch comes to sit on the now tottering throne of his father and rule as czar of all the Russias he will be known as Alexis II. It is said the nihilists have marked him for slaughter. His birth on Aug. 12 was hailed with joy throughout Russia. A salute of 101 guns was fired announcing it. When but twenty-four hours old he was made honorary colonel of the Finland guards. Before he is a year old he will have been decorated with many titles of church and state.

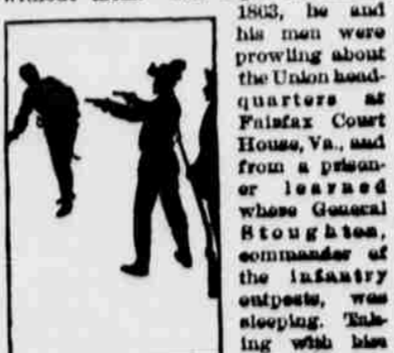
When the czarowitz was christened on Aug. 24 the church bells rang throughout Russia, the czar issued a manifesto announcing numerous reforms, not many of which have since been carried out, and the christening itself was a scene of unworldly splendor.



THE CZAROWITZ ALEXIS NICHOLAIEVITCH, even for Russia. The baby had as sponsors an emperor and an empress, two kings, a princess and four grand duchesses. He owns caps and cloaks and robes of gold and precious stones. One of his caps is ornamented with forty-two large gems. He has a shawl cape of cloth of gold which contains pictures of religious scenes all worked out in gems. In the Imperial nursery where little Alexis will play and study he will be attended by dwarfs, descendants, as tradition says, of the midwives whom Peter the Great employed as spit turners in the Imperial kitchen.

Colonel Jack Mosby's Ruse.

Colonel Jack Mosby, the Confederate raider, was not very particular who he picked up on his raids around the country, but of course preferred a prisoner with straps on his shoulders to one without them. One night in March,



1863, he and his men were prowling about the Union headquarters at Fairfax Court House, Va., and from a prisoner learned whose General Stoughton, commander of the infantry outpost, was sleeping. Telling with him a few trusty men, Mosby stole up to the general's house, and as General Stoughton turned to face the intruders he was confronted by a brace of revolvers. "You're my prisoner!" said the guerrilla. "My name is Mosby—Jack Mosby, at your service. Stonewall Jackson's between you and your army." And Stoughton was so thoroughly deceived that, though having an army of several thousand within call, he allowed Mosby to carry him off.
