ROSEBURG HIGH SCHOOL VICTORIOUS

The Roseburg high school football team returned victorious from their trip to Ashland and Grants Pass. Although the R. H. S. only tied Ashland in the game Wednesday, yet it considers its southern trip a complete victory.

In the Ashland game, players from the town and Normal teams were unable to score against the strictly high school team from Roseburg.

In the Grants Pass game the four star players for Grants Pass were not high school men in any sense of the word, and Roseburg won by a score of 11 to 6, or lost by a score of 12 to 11, just as the "Rules Committee" will see fit to decide later.

The game at Grants Pass was called at 3 o'clock. Roseburg kicked off to Grants Pass. Grants Pass could not be stopped till they had crossed the goal line, which they did in fifteen minutes of play. They kicked the goal, making the score of 6 to 0 in their favor. Grants Pass kicked off to Roseburg and the ball went across the goal line. Grants Pass came up and picked up the ball to carry it back and kick over. The referee, the Supt. of the schools, let them walk off with the ball. When some distance in the field he told Grants Pass to kick the goal as it was a touchdown, declaring the ball was dead behind the line the minute Grants Pass touched it. Roseburg protested and it was finally agreed to let the "Rules Committee" settle it and the score be announced then. Grants Pass kicked the goal.

Roseburg was aroused and started to stow Grants Pass how to play ball. They received the kick on their own 15 yd. line. With but 3 1/2 minutes to play they bucked the full length of the field in 2 1/2 minutes for a touchdown. It took seven downs to cover the entire distance. Roseburg failed to kick the goal.

In the second half Roseburg got the ball and advanced it the full length of the field without a pause for a second touchdown. Hanan kicked the goal. Neither side was able to score after that. However the "Rules Committee" decide, one thing is evident, the strictly high school team from Roseburg made two touchdowns by straight play, while Grants Pass with four outside players really made but one. The Grants Pass game will in no way affect Roseburg in its race for the championship, for their principal signed a statement that his team was not a high school team.

The Roseburg boys won many friends on the trip by their good behavior and clean playing. The trip was very much enjoyed by the team and the boys return in high spirits, and will work hard to make up the time lost on the trip. Roseburg should certainly be proud of its high school team.

ROSEBURG NOW BECOMING CITYFIED

The Telephone People are Putting all the Latest Devices for Giving Good Service.

The much-desired improvement in the local service of the Sunset Telephone and Telegraph Company, is now an assured fact, for already a large force of workmen is on the ground and busily engaged in making extensive improvements.

The new headquarters in the new Marsters block, on Cass street, ear being put into shape and already there are some indications of the magnitude of the general change which is contemplated, although it will be several weeks before everything is completed.

Foreman J. W. Aspland, of Portland, who, in 1896 installed the local exchange and put in the long distance line, has a force of 15 men at work and they are making quite a showing. Just now they are digging trenches along the main streets, into which the conduits are to be placed, which means that Roseburg has assumed city airs and will now have these lines all under ground, a thing which will be appreciated by one and all, and especially by the members of the fire department, who know how risky a thing it is to try to fight a fire when there are a lot of "live" telephone wires in front of the burning structure.

"We are here to give you people of Roseburg the very best service it is possible to give," said Foreman Aspland, to the Plaindealer man, "and to this end no money or pains are being spared to get the very best and latest appliances for serving our patrons. The switchboard will have double the capacity of the one now in use, and it will be so good that both the public and our force will enjoy doing business with it. All the lines on the main thoroughfares of the city will be placed underground, and distributing poles will be placed in each block. Yes, when all the work contemplated is finished, you people will have no occasion to complain of the service rendered by our company, for there will be no excuse for not giving you the best of service."

Foreman Aspland let drop a remark which seemed to indicate that his corporation was leaving no stone unturned to get such good service as to leave no room for complaint, and to thus head off the coming of the rival company, which is now working its way up through California, and which will, more than likely ask permission to enter Douglas county, and thus divide the field with the old company.
