PASSED AT THE SECOND SHARRON OF THE COR-AT-SECOND TONGRESS.

IGENERAL NATURE NO. 561

AN ACT making supportations for the legislative, executive and judicial expenses of the government for the year entiring June thirdigh, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and for other purposes. Be it muched by the Senate and House of

Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums-be, and the same are hereby, appropriated, out of any money of the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the service of the fiscal year ending June thirtieth eighteen hundred and seventy-three, for the objects hereinafter expressed, namely:
