Disaster on the Lakes.

DETROIT, Dec. 16.—Captain J. Wham, marine reporter, states the number of deaths on the lakes during the present season at 1,056, a decrease from last year of 131. Of this number, 536 occurred on Lake Michigan, 152 on Lake Huron, 139 on Lake Erie, 62 on Lake Ontario and 49 on the rivers. Eighty-five vessels of all descriptions, with the exception of sailing craft, 14,737 tons, valued at \$1,198,590, were commissioned during the year.
