In calling conven-tions for the election of delegates the com-mittees of the several States are recom-mended to invite all Republican electors and all other voters, without regard to past political differences or party affila-tions, who are opposed to reviving section-al issues, and desire to promote friendly feeling and permanent harmony in the country by maintaining the constitutional rights of every citizen, including the full and free exercise of the right of suffrage. and free exercise of the right of suffrage, without latimidation and fraud; of the continued prosecution and punishment of all official dishonesty, and of an economical administration of Government by hon-est, faithful and capable officers; who are in favor of making such reform in the Gov r ment as experience may suggest; who are imposed to impairing the credit of the nation by depreciating its obligations, and in favor of sustaining in it every way, with faith and financial honor: who hold that the common school system is the nursery of American liberty; and should be maintained absolutely free from secter ian control; who believe, for the promo-tion of these ends, that the direction of the Government should continue to be confided to those who adhere to the principles of 1876 and support them as incorporated in the constitution and laws, and who favor recognizing and strengthening the funda-mental principle of national unity in the oentennial year of the Republic.
