#### ADDITIONAL POSTAL LAWS.

The following sections of a law have been passed by Congress and approved by the President:

SECTION 15. That transient newspapers and SECTION 15. That transient newspapers and magazines, regular publications designed pri-marily for advertising purposes, or for free cir-culation at nominal rates, and all printed mat-ter of the third class except unscaled circulars, shall be admitted in the mails at the rate of one cent for every two ounces or fractional part thereof, and one cent for each two additional




