John Mitchell on the Know-Nothing.

We take the following extracts from an article in the Citizen, edited by John Mitchell, the Irish Patriot:

All their plans and organizations, their principles (as they call them), their secret machinations, resolutions and pass-words are all as well known now to the newsboys and the rest of mankind...

As for their specific action—their virtuous scorn of office and spoils—their self-denying ordinance, to put forward no candidates of their own—they who could sweep the Union—it was pretty clear how long that would hold.

Now, therefore, we have No-Nothing tickets. Self-denying principles do not thrive here. Public virtue, true Religion, and genuine Americanism, are not support enough for a platform...

At some municipal elections, by dexterously giving their support to one party or another, they were said to have gained triumphs. Nobody concerned were interested in contradicting them; in fact, nobody was sure, then, that this was not a powerful party...

Now all is changed. In vain, in Pennsylvania (which was said to be strong ground for them), in vain they voted against the administration—for Mott as Canal Commissioner and for the administration against a democratic Congressman...

The duties of Irish and of all foreign citizens in such a case are, we respectfully submit, plain enough. Since the establishment of the Citizen, we have uniformly urged upon Irish citizens that they should not act together as Irishmen...

to be indifferently Democrats or Whigs, Harbs, Softs, Silver-grays,—anything except Garrisonian abolitionists.

But here is an element coming in, that alters the whole case. Here comes a set of ignorant malignants, taking it upon them to represent the great American nation, to maintain its honor and to guard its religion (the vagabonds!) and they say to their Irish fellow-citizens, No, you shall never become wholly American—you are to be isolated for ever—you are unfit to enjoy the liberties...

Can there be any doubt as to how any Irish, or any German citizen, ought to treat these creatures? In this one case, at any rate, foreign-born men are isolated, though not by their own act.

Whosoever shall act otherwise at the approaching elections favours, upon the foot that spurs him, kisses the hand that would wrest the franchise from his children, and confesses that he and his are content to be helots and Pariahs in the free land of their adoption...

The resolutions which we publish in another column, introduced in the Legislature by Delazon Smith, speak the sentiments of the great Democratic party.
