Dave Barnett was in town today and tells us that W. F. Hammer's residence in which was located the Haystack post-office, was burned last night. A portion of the household goods and some of the postoffice records were saved. The loss was partly covered by insurance.

Antelope Herald: The first sheep to be shorn at the Kincaid corral last week were a band of wethers belonging to P. J. Walsh. Among them were about 1000 three-year-olds. Last year when the price of sheep was down, Mr. Walsh was offered \$1.75 for these sheep, but refused to sell. This year each sheep yielded a fleece worth about \$2.50, and after shearing the sheep were worth about \$3 per head, making a total value of \$5.50, an increase in value of \$3.75 for the year. Good feed-in; weather during the winter and fine prices for sheep and wool made the past year an unusually successful one for sheepmen.

Work on the Auto Road.
The work of widening and preparing the automobile road for the big auto was commenced at the Madras end of the road this week and working toward Cross Keys. John Hammond is superintending the work and has seven men and a road grader employed.
When the big auto first passed over the road, the grade was found in many places to be too narrow, the cattleguards were defective and in several places the road was not properly rolled. Where the auto road was solid and properly rolled the big machine gave perfect satisfaction, and the crew now employed will place road in good order so that when the gut next starts it will probably meet with no obstacles.

The Oregon Wool Market.
The highest price ever paid for Southern Oregon wool put the Herrin and Barron clips into the hands of Portland buyers. The sale was made at Asbland and the figure was 28 cents. Herrin & Son have begun shearing, and expect to have 12,000 pounds of wool of the latest clip. It is reported that the wool from this shearing will average \$2.50 per sheep in value to Herrin & son. Shearing has not yet begun at the Barron ranch, but the yield is expected to be about 10,000 pounds.
Ewen McLennan, the largest owner of sheep in Wasco county, has sold his clip of wool, amounting to about 160,000 pounds, to Frankenstein & Co., a Boston firm. The price is reported to have been 20 1/2 cents a pound. Other sales of wool reported in that territory are: Wagner & Boyer, 7300 fleeces; Knox & Caldwell, 2800 fleeces; C. P. Ragdale, 30,000 pounds, and Donam McKay, 1900 fleeces. All these purchases were made by J. N. Burgess for Koshland & Co. The McKay wool brought 21 cents, the other lots 20 cents.
