It is not known how much of the fleet is thought to have been in neutral waters or is scattered in the high seas.

CLONDBURSTS NUMEROUS

Word reach Madras yesterday that Heppner had had another flood, five persons were drowned and a portion of the town washed away. But later it was learned four persons were drowned from a flood which occurred Tuesday afternoon on Rays creek which empties into Willow creek below Heppner about 10 miles from that town. A cloudburst is said to have struck Antelope canyon above that town and water ran down the streets three or four feet deep. A four-horse team of horses standing in the street is reported to have been washed several blocks but escaped drowning. No material damage is reported to the town. Monday this section was visited by thunder shower which was a record breaker while it lasted, about 25 minutes, and it seemed as if a miniature flood had struck this place. The rain was preceded by an electric storm which lasted for possibly an hour, and just before the down-pour there was a big clap of thunder which sounded mighty close. Water stood on the streets one or two inches deep. The storm was accompanied by a brisk wind from the southwest. In a few minutes the sun was shining brightly, the air fragrant as a full-blown rose, and all was calm as an Autumn evening. 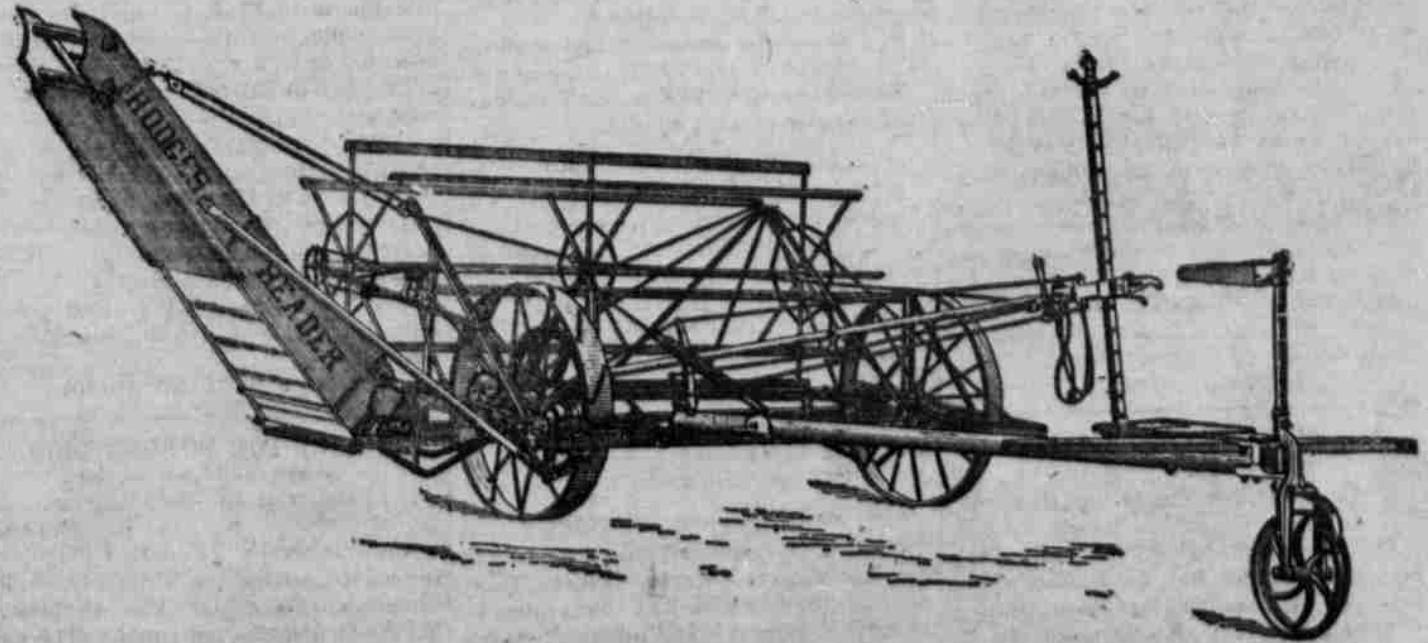
PETITION FOR LIQUOR LICENSE.
