

### Five Great Men.

The names of five great men stand before all others in the Government under which we now live: George Washington, for his services in winning the independence of the United States and the weight of wisdom with which he set the new government in operation; James Madison, for taking the principal part in the framing of the Constitution; Alexander Hamilton, for persuading the people to adopt the Constitution and for his bold measures, which gave shape and strength to the Federalist party; Thomas Jefferson, for illustrating the true principles of democracy, and for the sagacity with which he conducted the first great change of party supremacy in 1801; John Marshall, for his work as Chief Justice of the United States from 1800 to 1835, in interpreting the Constitution and increasing its elasticity by profound judicial decisions. These five men, more than any others, have shaped the whole future of American history.—Fiske's School History of the United States.
