Railroad Party Here.

The party of representatives of the Harriman interests, who are making a trip of investigation through Central Oregon in order to determine whether or not the business to be secured between Shaniko and Bend will justify the extension of the Columbia Southern Railway from its present terminus at Shaniko, arrived at Madras yesterday afternoon. The party is composed of General Manager O'Brien of the O. R. & N. Company, Chief Engineer G. W. Boschke, General Freight Agent K. B. Miller, W. W. Cotton, General Counsel for the O. R. & N. Co., Col. R. C. Judson of the industrial department of the same company, President E. E. Lytle of the Columbia Southern Railway, Professor French of the State University of Idaho, at Moscow, and Fred S. Stanley, secretary of the Deschutes Irrigation & Power Company at Bend.

Haystack and Culver, and the entire day will be spent in a thorough investigation of the grain producing area of the Willow Creek basin and its surrounding plateau. Prof. French is an expert on soils, and will make numerous tests to determine the productivity of the soil of this district. Tomorrow the party will go to Bend to see the great desert of Crook county which is being brought under irrigation. From Bend they will go to Prineville, and then back to Shaniko, where their special train is in waiting. This itinerary will cover the best portion of Crook county's agricultural district, and will give a good general idea of the magnitude of the area which is susceptible to cultivation, although necessarily only a small portion of the lands already under cultivation can be seen from the main traveled road.

The people of this section of the state, who are interested in the extension of the Columbia Southern Railway and better transportation facilities, have nothing to fear from an investigation which is thorough, complete and exhaustive. The area susceptible to cultivation is larger than the wheat district of Sherman County, the good crops raised in recent years is the best proof of the productivity of the soil, and the territory now under investigation will be its own strongest advocate for increased transportation facilities. Other investigations have been made in this territory, but it was because of their superficiality and lack of thoroughness that nothing ever resulted from these investigations.

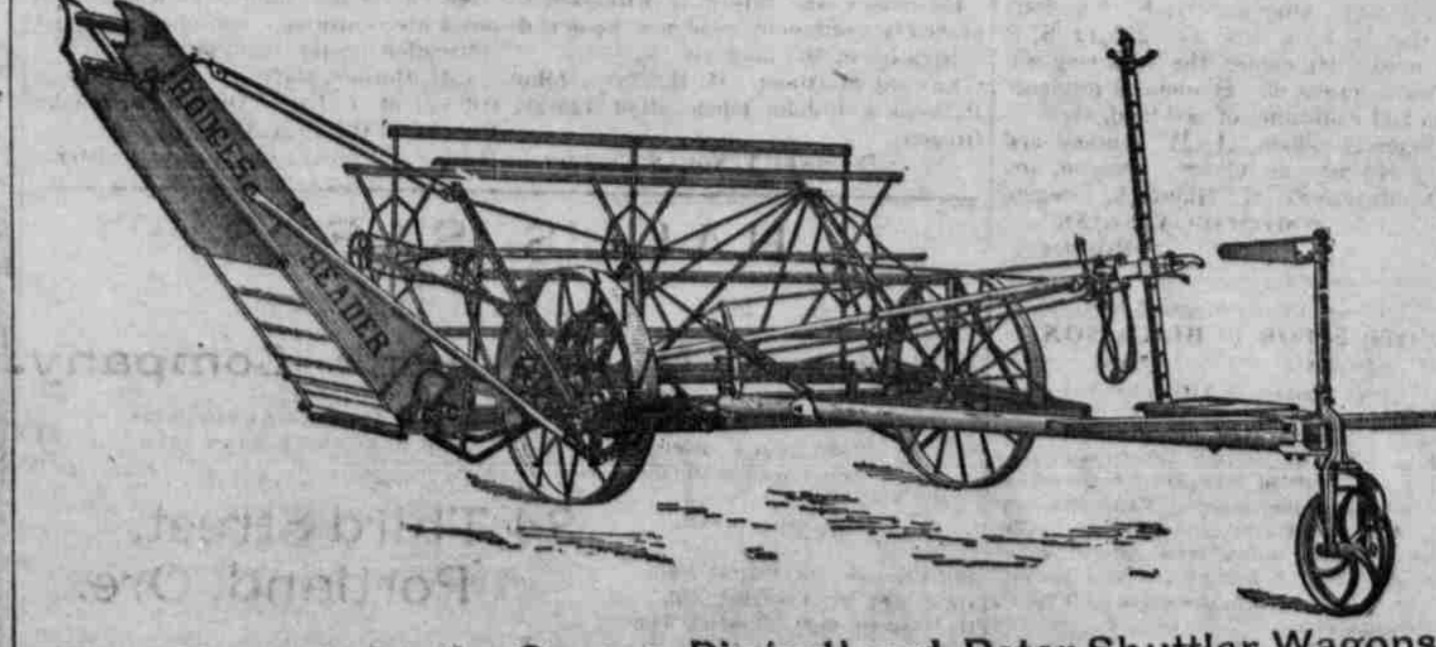
