WILLOW CREEK WILL RAISE SUGAR BEETS

Bend Bulletin.

Secretary Fred S. Stanley of the D. I. & P. Co., and F. H. Hopkins, until recently of the brokerage firm of Downing & Hopkins, came up from Portland this week and selected 6,000 acres of land on the Central Oregon canal, a dozen miles southeast of Bend, for a beet sugar enterprise. This land will be taken by their friends who will at once begin improvements and expect to raise a crop next season. The plan contemplates the build ing of a sugar mell and having control of enough production to insure its success. Outsiders will also be encouraged to raise augar beets, and the size of the mill to be constructed will be governed by the amount of land put into beets,

"I believe there is no part of the United States so well adapted to the beet sugar industry as this locality," said Mr. Stanley. "We have examined the question pretty-throughly and are convinced it will be unusually successful here, so we are going into it with confidence. We have selected the land, water will be flowing out to it in the coming two or three weeks, and the work of clearing and preparing the soil will then be taken up. We expect to have a crop next season."
