The supreme court of Oregon has declared the tax levy on migratory sheep unconstitutional, because inequality of taxation would be established were the law carried into exa

This law was passed by the last legislature, and provided that owners of livestock should pay taxes in counties' in which they graze their animals for such proportion of the year as the migratory herds vere so grazed. The suit to test the constitutionality of the law was brought in Lake county. and the decision of the supreme court is of much interest to all persons engaged in the livestock business.
