Telegram: "The returns of the census I have completed show that Crook county is growing faster in population than any other part of the state," declares County Assessor J. D. LaFollet of Prineville, who was in Portland yesterday. "During the past two years the growth of this county has been remarkable, and it is growing faster right now than at any time previous. Several precincts in the Madras section show an increase in population of 300 per cent during the past five years, while the old 'Bend' precinct shows an increase of 2200 per cent."

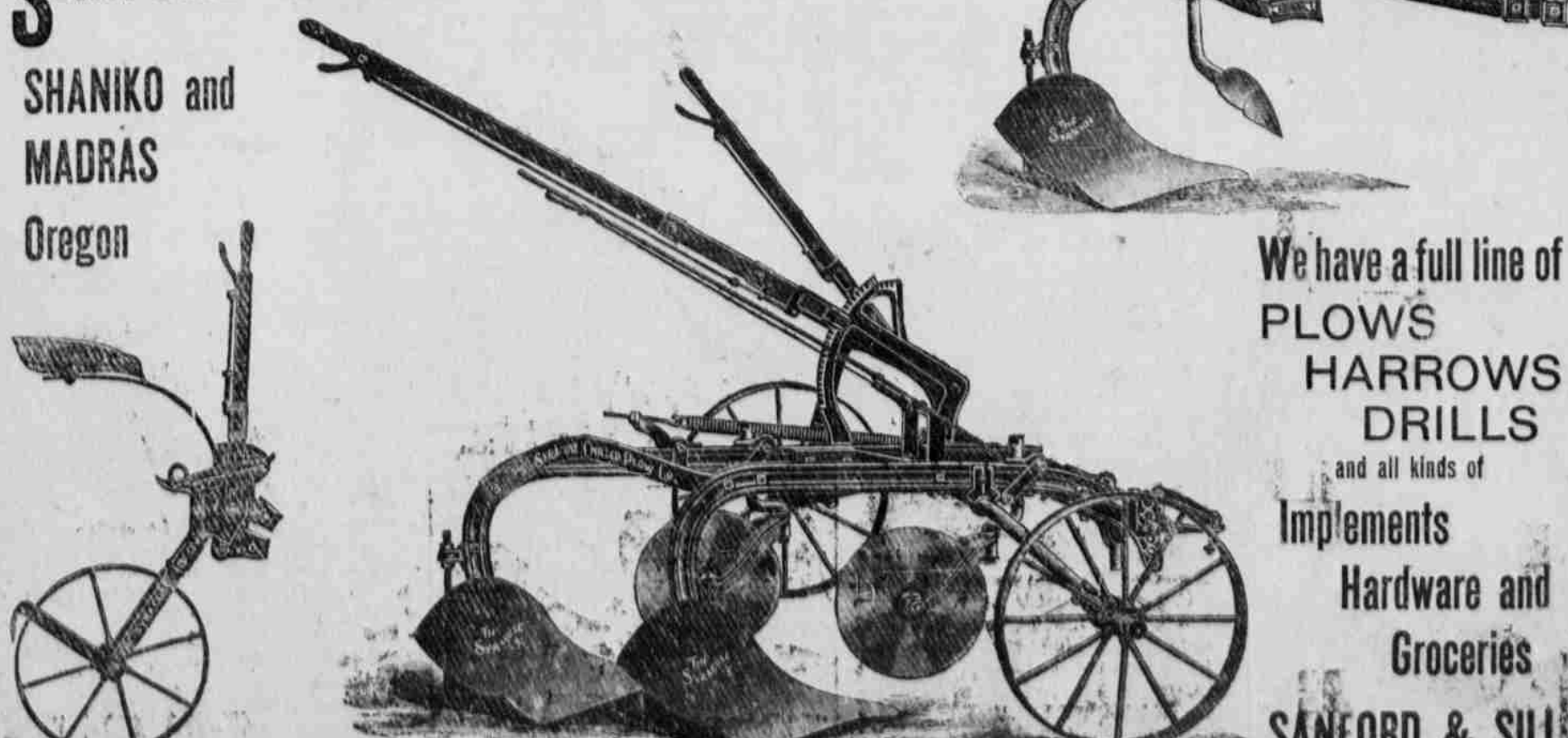
