The at tendance has been about two and a haif millions, fully two thirds of which were paid admissions. Financially the exposition has been a great surcess, the announcement having been made by President Goodthat fully \$100,000 will be returned to the subscribers. A the time the subscription for stock was taken, \$400,000 wa raised in Portland, and it was hot expected that any of i would be returned. About 25 per cent will, however, be re turned to the subscribers.

The new flouring mill of the Madras Milling & Mercantile Co. vas started up during the week and will soon be grinding out flour, regularly, although -ome delay is being experi enced just now to getting things to working property. The en gine was fired up last week or the purpose of testing the machinery, and on Monday of this week the grain was started on its journey to the follers, so as to be converted into flour. Owing to some minor troubles with he pumping machinery there is a slight delay in getting the mill into perfect working order, B. but within a few days the 'tightening up" process will be ver with and then the mill will begin to grand sa-adily.

The new flouring mill has a apacity of 50 barrels of flour per day. Max Putz, the secreary of the company, is an experienced miller, and in fact has he reputation of being one of the best millers in Eastern Oregon. 
