It is reported that in the Bend neighborhood the coyotes are so numerous that night is made hideous by their yelpings. Only a short time ago a band of cattle were stampeded by the coyotes near where the Lister sheep were killed. In this vicinity the coyotes are also very numerous, numbers of them howling closely about the town each night. On a drive of a few miles into the country in any direction, any day, several coyotes will be seen.
While this condition of affairs does not appeal with any great power to the residents of farming communities, whose interests are not exactly identical with those of the sheepmen, it is a serious situation for the sheepmen of Eastern Oregon.
