### THE NEW SENATOR.

John M. Gearin of Portland, who has been appointed by Governor Chamberlain to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Senator John H. Mitchell, is without doubt the ablest man in his party in this state, and in addition possesses a strong personality and a force of character which have made him appointment deservedly popular among Oregonians of every party. Although a life-long Democrat, Mr. Gearin has never belonged to that wing of the party which placed party success above principle, and on many of the great national issues of the day he will be found more in line with the conservative element of the Republican party than with the radicals in his own party. Mr. Gearin was a member of the law firm of Dolph, Mallory, Simon and Gearin, which firm has already given to the state of Oregon four United States senators. As a trial lawyer, Mr. Gearin has few equals in the state.

### MAIL CONTRACT NOT LET.

No satisfactory bids were received for service on Route No. 73306, from Heisler to Madras, under the general advertisement of September 15, 1905, and the post office department has now issued a bulletin advertisement for new bids for the contract on this route, for service from July 1, 1906, to June 30, 1910.

This route, No. 73306, from Heisler to Madras, a distance of eighteen miles, was created this fall, and it is therefore a new service. No bid under the advertisement will be considered unless submitted by a person who resides on or contiguous to the route. All bids under the new advertisement must be in the hands of the Second Assistant Postmaster General not later than January 17, 1906.

Recently the work of installing the hydraulic ram for Mr. Morris at Trail Crossing was finished and two minutes after starting it up the water had traversed the 370 feet of inch discharge pipe and began to flow out upon the hitherto barren desert. A number of spectators and prospective ram users were present and witnessed the starting up of the plant. The machine was operated for a short time only, some large leaks in the flame and intake tank having shown up, which somewhat reduced the amount of drive head from the normal. When these repairs are accomplished, Mr. Morris will operate the ram permanently for the winter irrigation. It may be of interest to note that this is the largest ram built and successfully operated, although Mr. Hesse, who installed the plant, says that his company is prepared to construct these machines in size requiring a drive pipe of 48 inches in diameter. Such a ram would have a capacity of approximately nine times that of the one here described.—Bend Bulletin.

Mrs. Ralph A. Brown was a visitor at the Percival home yesterday, from the Mad Springs school district where she is teaching.

Frank Loveland, the "well-drill-man" of Culver has made arrangements with the Madras Townsite Company for a lot upon which he intends to sink a deep well, one that will afford an ample supply of water for the tank-wagons and barrels that are brought in by the farmers of the Big and Little Plains and other surrounding districts. There has been a great deal of trouble in Madras this fall, owing to the extremely dry season just past, which caused a consequent shortage of water in all the local wells. In ordinary years the water lies about 15 feet below the surface and is there in inexhaustible quantities, but this year the wells have all had to be extended downwards 10 or 12 feet, and even then some of them have hardly afforded enough water to supply the ranchers. This well of Mr. Loveland's will supply the deficiency, and as he will erect a large tank, all the farmers need do will be to drive up to the tank, turn on the faucet and watch her fill up.
