Struck Artesian Water.

Blue Mountain Eagle
W. E. Burke, who in company with some Portland capitalists, is reclaiming a tract of desert land in the Harney valley under the Carey act, passed through Canyon City last week en route to Portland. Before leaving the scene of operations south of Harney City, he struck a flow of artesian water at a depth of 200 feet. He had driven one well and the water came to within a few feet of the surface. He transferred his well boring machine to a more favorable location, and upon reaching the depth of 200 feet, water flowed from his well, and while the flow was small, it is sufficient that he thinks it can be increased with depth. In drilling this depth no rock formation of any kind was encountered, the entire depth being through a clay formation.

To the Blue Mountain Eagle, Mr. Burke stated that if he was successful in increasing the flow of water from his well, the future of the great Harney valley will be assured. It will not be many years until tracts of land now covered with sagebrush will be supporting prosperous homes.

Christmas Mail Delayed.

Saturday's mail stage from Heisler brought no lock-sack containing letters and registered mail from the railroad, and as there was no other mail until Monday, many were the disappointed patrons of the Madras postoffice who were compelled to wait until Monday noon for their Christmas letters and packages. 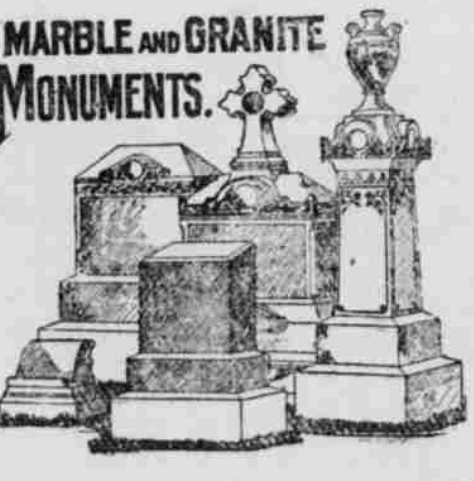
