#### Struck Artesian Water.

me Portland capitalists, is reclaiming a tract of desert land in the Harney valley under the Carey act, passed through Canyon City last week en route to Portind. Before leaving the scene of operations south of Harney City, he struck a low of artesian water at a depth of 200 eet. He had driven one well and the vater came to within a faw feet of the orface. He transferred his well bortog oachine to a more favorable location, and pon reaching the depth of 200 feet, water lowed from his well, and while the flaw was small, it is sufficient that he thinks it an be increased with depth. In drilling ais depth no rock formation of any kind vas encountered, the entire depth being brough a clay formation.

To the Blue Mountain Eagle, Mr. furke stated that if he was successful in screasing the flow of water from his well, he future of the great Harney valley wil e assured. It will not be many yearence until tracts of land now covered ith sagebrush will be supporting prosperus homes.
