The F. M. Loveland well which is being drilled on a lot in the same block and just south of the Pioneer office, has reached a depth of over 100 feet. At 40 feet basalt was struck, and they have been drilling in that ever since. Mr. Loveland expects to sink until he strikes a good flow of water, of which he thinks he will find plenty when gets through the basalt.

Prineville is to be connected with Albany by a telephone line extending across the Cascade Mountains, and the line will be completed as early in the spring as the work can be done across the mountains. The line will be built direct west from Prineville, across the Cascades to Cascadia, which is one of the most popular summer resorts in the Cascades.

William H. Ostrander of Ridgeway was in town last Friday offering final proof upon his homestead in that neighborhood. It had been reported at Antelope, where Ostrander is well known, that a horse he had been riding some three weeks ago had turned up without its rider, and that Ostrander had not been seen since that time, and considerable uneasiness was felt there on account of it. In inquiry was made by phone from Antelope on Saturday, and they were informed that Bill had been here "in the flesh" on the preceding day.

J. A. Messenger of Hillsboro has purchased the Madras hotel property from Archie Mason, the deal including the livery stable run in connection with the hotel, and the price being \$3900. Mr. Messenger expects to move here in the spring and go into business at this point. For the present the hotel has been leased to W. C. Moore and the barn to Charles Disney. Mr. Messenger visited in Madras for a week during the early fall, and his investment in property at this place resulted from the favorable impression of the town which he received at that time.

Railroad Engineers Arrive.

The party of railroad engineers in charge of F. S. Gordon, who are running the line up the Deschutes, arrived in Madras last Monday and have pitched camp on the flat back of the old Malloy building. They expect to be camped here for several weeks, while they are running the line up Willow creek and on south from here as far as they can conveniently work from this point. They have been camped at the T. B. Tucker ranch on the Deschutes for a week past.

Telephone Poles for New Line.

The poles for the new telephone line connecting this point with the Haycreek office of the long distance company have been set up, and the wire will be strung at once. The new line will be about 12 miles long and will give very much better service than has been had over the line to Prineville. The same company owns both lines and they are using the same poles as those used by the long distance company in order to get connection with the long distance line.
