Mr. Gerould and his nephew, Howard Turner, spent yesterday going over the timber claim, it being required under recent ruling of the land department that applicants for timber land make a personal inspection of it just prior to the date of their proof.

Horse Killed in Runaway.

McTaggart & Bye lost a valuable horse in a runaway accident at the school section they are cultivating on Agency Plains, last Tuesday morning. Ed Balder, who has been doing the work for them on this place, had hitched four horses up to a disk harrow and was just starting out to harrow the land when one of the horses kicked over the tongue of the harrow and fell across it, breaking the tongue off short. This excited the other horses, and there was a general mix-up, one horse breaking his leg and two others being badly crippled in the mix up. It was necessary to kill the animal with the broken leg. The other horses were not seriously hurt.

Ed Balder, who was driving at the time of the accident, was thrown from his seat on the disk harrow in under the heel of the horses, but he escaped without injury.
