Will Raithert brought over a small load of Haycreek coal for F. J. Brooks, last week, and with which Mr. Brooks expects to make a number of experiments to test its value for use in the forge. The coal has been reported to be first class blacksmith coal, and if this should be found to be true it would mean quite a saving to the blacksmiths of this section of the country, who must now pay about \$40 per ton for blacksmith coal laid down here. The coal which has been brought here was taken from near the surface, and there will naturally be some deterioration in value owing to the action of the elements.

Equal suffrage was defeated in the state by a majority of about 10,000, but the leaders of the movement for woman's suffrage say they are not discouraged and will try again next time. In Portland and other centers of population a great campaign for equal suffrage was waged, many of the most prominent women of Portland being active at the polls on election day. The fight was also carried into every county in the state, a number of prominent equal suffrage speakers being imported from other states. The large majority against this constitutional amendment was a surprise even to those who opposed it.
