BIG CONTRACT LET

Grading For Oregon Eastern To Be gin at Klamath Falls This Winter.

Oregonian from Klamath Falls through next week. says: Mason, Davis & Company of Portland, contractors of the first unit of the Klamath project, have secured the first big DR. HABOLD CLARKE contract on the Klamath Falls end of the Oregon Eastern Railroad, said to be for a stretch of 100 miles.

Archie Mason, who has had Q. C. COLLYER personal direction of the work here, is now on his way to Portland to confer with his partners and officials of the railroad, it is stated, on what is W H. Awarding of the contract is evidence that the intention of the management of the Harriman system is to complete the entire line from Natron to Klamath Falls during 1907, and make the through line by way of Weed a realization as soon as the line is finished to this point, which will be about August.

The contract was given to the Portland firm some time since, but it has not been made public for reasons satisfactory to the railroad officals. Plans for labor are well formulated.
