CHANGE IN THE MAIL SERVICE

THURSDAY

RECOMMENDED.

It is currently reported that a change in the mail route has been recommended by Superintendent Vaille, but that the proposed change does not accord fully with the requirements in Western Crook, as expressed in the monster petition recently forwarded to the postmaster general. The proposed change, according to the report which is going the rounds, provides for a route around Grizzly Mountain to O'Neils, and a Y there, one line going on to Prineville and the other to Bend, with a spor to Lamonta, the Madras office to be served through Haycreek. This proposed change does not overcome many of the objections which were urged against the old mail route, and for that reason will be unsatisfactory to those who have petitioned for the change in the mail service. The recommendation, if it is true that one has been made. was made before the petition was forwarded to the postal department, and the fact that a change is recommended by the superintendent of the service may prove of great assistance in securing the changes outlined in the petition, as a very strong showing is made by the peittioners.


