BETTER SERVICE REQUIRED

When the Heisler post office was discontinued and necessity for a change in the mail service arose, only two ways of securing a mail service for this point were suggested by the department, one of them being from Haycreek, and the other a return to the old service from Grizzly. Of these two, the service from Haycreek is infinitely better, but it still will not be as good service as we are getting at this time. Heisler, or some point on Hay Creek between that station and the mouth of Hay Creek, is the natural point of divergence from the old Prineville road, for all business and traffic for this section and the entire Deschutes River region. No other route will give us as direct connection with our nearest railroad point as one which leaves the Prineville road at Heisler, or below there, comes up through the natural passageway afforded by the Lyle & Brown gap in the rimrock, and on to the high plateau lands bordering the Deschutes, by a natural grade. Most of the travel and freighting for Central Oregon comes by that route, even a large number of the Prineville freighters coming this way to take advantage of the easy grades and uniformly good roads.

With the establishment of the new service in January, the post offices of Youngs, Madras, Culver and Lamonta will each be served by a separate mail route, while all of them should be served by one direct route branching off at or below Heisler, if that were possible. The difficulty appears to be that there is no office there from which they can be served, but this difficulty may be solved soon, as it is rumored that a move will be made by residents of lower Trout to secure an office near there for their convenience. The establishment of the direct mail route from Shaniko to Bend would solve the whole problem, but whether or not that is established now, the people of this section should be given a more direct mail service as soon as it can be done.
