Happenings at Madras.

Jim Read of Culver was in town last Friday evening.

John Trotter was in town last Friday from Young's Flat.

Fred Fisher was in town last Friday evening, from Fisherville.

J. C. Rush, the Lamonta merchant, was in Madras last Friday.

Will Barber was in town last Friday evening from the Culver neighbor hood.

Chester Roush was at Cross Keys on Tuesday buying beef for his market at this place.

Born, to the wife of Joe Arney, on Agency Plains, Thursday, February 21, 1907, a daughter.

Henry Dietzel has been looking after business matters at the county-seat during the past week.

Orval Davis and Miss Grace Parrish of Haycreek attended the Woodman dance at this place Friday evening.

Austria Wall, who has been working at Shaniko during the Winter, returned to his homestead south of this place last Friday.

S. P. Conroy, who left here a year or more ago, returned last Saturday evening. He spent the night in Madras, and left next morning for Prineville.

A. C. Sanford has had a well drilled on his residence lot on the north side of the townsite. A good flow of water was found at about 26 feet, but the well was drilled 20 feet deeper than that to form a reservoir, as he expects to irrigate his garden from this well.

Miss Myrtle Gard has returned from Oregon City. On her way home she got as far as Wasco, where she was held up on account of the washout on the Columbia Southern, and as there was no stage running, she was compelled to phone out for a private conveyance. One of her brothers drove to Wasco for her.

Gottfried Kamper and wife were in Madras from their ranch on Trout creek the first of the week. Mr. Kamper is in the sheep business and reports his stock in good condition after the unusually hard Winter. He had plenty of feed for his sheep, and his losses were only a trifle more than a natural loss in the number of sheep he owns.

Col. W. H. Reynolds was in town last Friday from the Clingau ranch three miles beyond Culver, which he is cultivating this season. He says that they have had even more snow in that locality than fell here, the heaviest snowfall being about two feet deep on the level. The prospects for a big crop during the coming season are unusually good.

The big Loveland drill has been moved to the Hunter place on Opal Prairie, and drilling will soon begin on the community well to be sunk at that place. The well will be sunk to a depth of 500 feet if necessary, the contract covering that amount of drilling, but it is not believed that it will be necessary to go to that depth to secure water. The well is being sunk by the Opal Prairie Prospecting Company, which is composed of a number of ranchers of that locality.

G. Springer returned last Friday evening from Salem, where he spent the past five weeks in the interest of the movement for the creation of Jefferson county. Although the bill for the creation of Jefferson county was defeated, Mr. Springer does not feel discouraged by the outcome, inasmuch as the fight which was waged resulted in keeping all the northern Crook county territory intact. Mr. Springer staged it out from The Dalles as in the old days before the building of the Columbia Southern.

J. C. Waymire is building a large reservoir in the hillside just north of his well and by Spring expects to have a very complete water system in operation, from which to supply the numerous ranchers who haul water from this place. The reservoir will have a capacity of about 30,000 gallons, and water will be pumped into it from the big well below the hill. Mr. Waymire recently installed a new steam engine and pump at the well and it is giving much better satisfaction than the old gasoline engine which furnished power in the past. The reservoir which he is building will be excavated in the solid bedrock on the hill, and will then be cemented in order to prevent leakage through the cracks in the rock.
