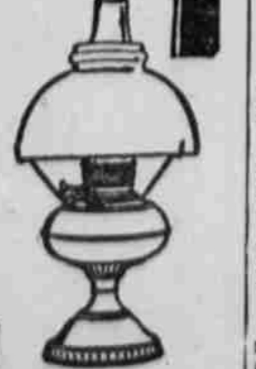

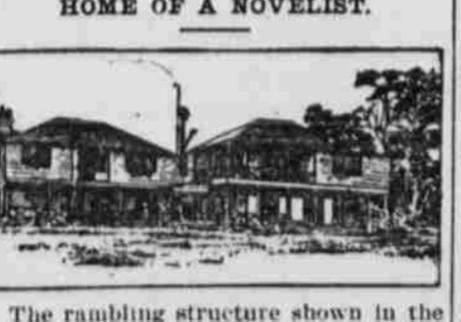
HOME OF A NOVELIST.

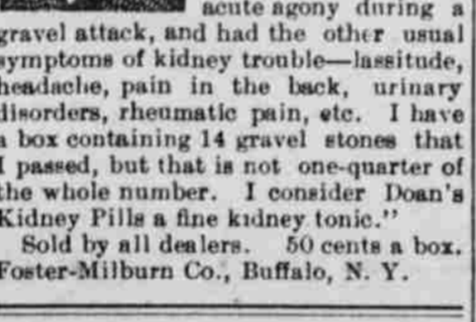
