LAWS FOR TROUT FISHING

The fishing season opened the first of this month, but owing to the cold rainy weather which has prevailed most of the time since that date, very little fishing has been done by local fishermen. For the benefit of these local disciples of Sir Isaac Walton, we publish below the substance of the most important provisions in the state law governing the sport:

1. It shall be unlawful to take catch, kill or have in possession, any trout except salmon trout during the months of November, December, January, February and March of any year.

2. It shall be unlawful at anytime to take, catch or kill or have in possession at any time, any trout, char or salmon less than five inches in length.

3. It shall be unlawful to take, catch or kill at any time in the waters of this state, any trout by any means whatever except with hook and line.

4. It shall be unlawful for any person to take kill or capture more than 125 trout in one day.

5. Any violation of any of these provisions is punishable by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100.
