## HATFIELD, RAINMAKER

Experiments Partially Successful—Engaged in Sherman for Next Year

C. M. Hatfield, professional rainmaker and in a class by himself, has completed his experiments in Sherman County this season, and so successful were his efforts this year that he has been engaged again for next season. Mr. Hatfield was engaged to go to Sherman County and conduct his experiments in rain making this season, and was promised \$1500 if he would cause a rainfall of six inches between May 25 and July 25. He went there with the understanding that during that period there was an average natural rainfall of 2.5 inches, upon which basis he promised to increase it to six. When he arrived in Sherman county, however, he found that the average rainfall during that season was only .62 of an inch, and he then told his employers that he would have to withdraw from his contract. They told him to go ahead and do the best he could. During the period while he was conducting the experiments, there was a precipitation of 2.2 inches, an increase of 250 per cent over the average, and the second largest rainfall ever recorded in that section. Whether Mr. Hatfield produced the rain or not is a mooted question among the farmers of Sherman County, but so well satisfied were they with his efforts this season that he has been engaged again for next season, when he agrees to produce two inches of rain between May 1 and July 10, for which he is to receive \$1000; if two and a half inches fall, he is to receive \$1500. The experiments next year will be conducted at a different location, a point on the Deschutes River a few miles above this year's location, having been selected for the next tests.

The rainmaker has great faith in his process of producing precipitation, and freely states that within a few years he expects to have demonstrated absolutely the merits of his discovery. He says in an interview in a Portland paper: "One-third of the United States is semi arid land that I believe will be made very productive through my system. Some day the government will have chains of these towers built throughout these arid regions. In nearly all these places there is plenty of moisture in the atmosphere, waiting to be precipitated."
