WARMSPRINGS HAS TELEPHONE

Warm Springs is now connected with the outside world by telephone, the line between the Agency and Wapinitia having been completed last Saturday. Madras, the nearest town to the Agency and within 15 miles of it, has to talk with Warm Springs by way of The Dalles, a distance of over 200 miles. Superintendent Covey has offered to extend the government line to the ferry, provided the Madras line would be extended so as to connect with it at that point, and this will doubtless be done in the near future.


