Crook county is without mai again today, and it may be for several days, with the excep tion of such local mail as is exchanged between the severa towns in the county. A card from the postmaster at Shaniko. the distributing point for this district, states that there was no mail for the interior from either east or west, owing to the change of schedule in the O. R. & N. trains. By the new schedule the overland trains do not stop at Biggs, and the new loca train has no authority to carry mails, and so a large portion of Central Oregon goes without its mail.

There appears to be no earthly reason why the O. R. & N. could not have continued to carry the mails as heretofore on its overland trains until the local train had authority to carry it, except that the Harriman lines in Oregon never have ex erted themselves in the direction of efficient service, And Central Oregon especially has felt the inefficiency of the Har riman policy. It is remembered that last winter when the wash outs occurred on both the main line and the Columbia Southern, Central Oregon went without mail for 30 days, while no effort was being made to repair the damage on the Columbia ham, of Sisters, Oregon.
