**AGAIN NO MAIL**

Crook county is without mail again today, and it may be for several days, with the exception of such local mail as is exchanged between the several towns in the county. A card from the postmaster at Shaniko, the distributing point for this district, states that there was no mail for the interior from either east or west, owing to the change of schedule in the O. R. & N. trains. By the new schedule the overland trains do not stop at Biggs, and the new local train has no authority to carry mails, and so a large portion of Central Oregon goes without its mail.

There appears to be no earthly reason why the O. R. & N. could not have continued to carry the mails as heretofore on its overland trains until the local train had authority to carry it, except that the Harriman lines in Oregon never have exerted themselves in the direction of efficient service. And Central Oregon especially has felt the inefficiency of the Harriman policy. It is remembered that last winter when the washouts occurred on both the main line and the Columbia Southern, Central Oregon went without mail for 30 days, while no effort was being made to repair the damage on the Columbia Southern, and no attempt was made to get through by other means the rapidly accumulating mails.

**THE BROWN ASSASSINATION**

Up until the time the last news was received from the outside, the murderers of ex-Sheriff Brown of Baker City, had not been apprehended, and there remained scant hope of running them down. Thus will another of those dastardly crimes which have disgraced the west in recent years go unpunished.

The murder of ex-Sheriff Brown bears all the earmarks of a Western Federation crime. The time, just prior to the trial of Pettibone, when a demonstration of the federation's vengeance may be most effective; the manner, so closely resembling that in other crimes laid at their door; the victim, a person who possessed information dangerous to federation officials; all stamp it as another dastardly crime to be added to the long list of crimes uncovered by the Orchard confession. How long is it to go on? Has it reached a pass where every enemy of the Western Federation of Miners is a person marked for death at the hands of the hired assassins of that organization? These are the questions that men are asking themselves since the Brown murder, and the answer should be such an uprising against anarchy and assassination that it would mean the extirpation of the Western Federation of Miners, root and branch.

Henry Cleek of Albany, one of the pioneer settlers of Crook county, is visiting in this vicinity and looking after business matters. Mr. Cleek was at one time one of the largest owners of land in this portion of Crook county.
