AN INVASION THREATENED

For a dozen years back Central Oregon has been looking for a railroad, hope being kept alive by repeated promises of the extension of the Corvallis & Eastern, or the construction of a Harriman line into this section. These promises have invariably failed of fulfillment, and the recent utterances of Mr. Harriman, after his trip through Central Oregon and following upon his purchase of the Corvallis & Eastern, which headed off the possibility of an extension of that road, show conclusively that the Harriman interests never did intend building into Central Oregon until forced to do so by the threatened invasion of this territory by other interests. That fact is established, and the possibility of a Harriman line into Central Oregon may be reckoned in exact proportion to the danger there is of other interests finding a way into this country through the Harriman blockade.

With this understanding of the railroad situation in Central Oregon, the prospects of railroad construction into this long neglected section look brighter at this time than ever before, by reason of the very imminent danger of an invasion of the territory from two new sources. The Oregon Trunk Line, an independent project, has secured right of way for its line up the Deschutes as far as Madras in spite of opposition which has delayed the construction of that line for more than a year, and almost at the same time there is news of the activity of the Mt. Hood electric road which indicates that that project is also pushing its way into the Harriman preserves. That the Harriman interests are badly scared by the appearance of one or both of these new dangers is evident in the sudden activity of the Harriman field corps, parties of engineers and surveyors in the employ of those interests being rushed into this territory with a haste that is ludicrous in the light of the long years of absolute neglect this country has had at Harriman's hands.

Central Oregon is going to have a railroad soon, and probably two, for no one has ever doubted that Harriman would build whenever the danger of an invasion of his preserves became imminent, and that time has arrived. The Mt. Hood road is backed by ample capital, and while no announcements are being made, the activity of that company in acquiring power sites along the Deschutes is a much more definite announcement than anything the officials of the company could say. The Oregon Trunk Line, too, with its possibilities of a Hill connection, is a project that threatens, and although its promoters have confessed to some trouble in financing it, their perfected right of way is a valuable asset, and the practicability of the route and its advantageous connections at the Columbia River should make it an easy project financed as soon as the money market becomes more settled. With the unlimited resources for rapid construction at his

hand, it's probable that Harriman could build into Central Oregon more quickly than any of the other projected lines, and that the time has come when he may have to do so appears very probable to those who have kept in touch with the situation. At any rate the transportation problem in Central Oregon has reached an acute stage, and it is very likely that there will be something doing before the next year is very old.

Oregon Trunk Assembling Supplies at Miller's Bridge

PICKS, SHOVELS AND SCRAPERS THERE

H. C. Ellis of Bend Says He Saw Implements With His Own Eyes
—Promise Will Be Kept

The news comes on reliable authority that the Oregon Trunk Line railway is delivering large numbers of picks, shovels, scrapers and other grading implements on their right of way at Miller's Bridge, about one mile above the railroad bridge on the Deschutes River and that every indication points toward the commencement of grading at that point within a very short time.

H. C. Ellis, U. S. Commissioner at Bend, is authority for this statement, and is reported to have said that he saw the supplies with his own eyes. Mr. Ellis has just returned from Portland, bringing home a new automobile which he purchased and passed by Miller's Bridge enroute.

The corps of surveyors under Robert Rea have just finished their work of correcting defects in the survey along that portion of the line, new plats for right of way having been filed at The Dalles land office.

Everything seems to indicate the recent announcement by officials of the company that construction will commence at an early date and that the new year will inaugurate the building of the Oregon Trunk to Madras, was made in good faith, and that the Deschutes River road will be the first to give transportation relief to Central Oregon.
